Alertness

Find the definition.

Dictionary definition:

Watchful and prompt to meet danger or emergency, quick to perceive and act.

IBLP operational definition:

Being aware of that which is taking place around me so I can have the right response to it

Expand with synonyms, antonyms, or related words.

Synonyms: observant, open-eyed, vigilant, wakeful, wary, watchful, wide awake

Antonyms: overlook, unaware, unobservant

Identify the quality in Scripture.

Scripture references:

Luke 12:37, Rev. 3:2

Bible men and women who demonstrated this character quality:

Moses, Hannah, Samuel, David, Nehemiah, Daniel, Joseph,

Mary, the wise men, Peter, John, Stephen, Paul

Bible men and women who did not demonstrate this character quality:

Jonah (asleep during storm), Eli (misjudged Hannah), Pharisees (did not recognize Jesus as the Messiah), the disciples (sleeping while Jesus prayed)

Christ demonstrated this quality when:

The woman with an issue of blood touched His clothing; when
He saw the multitudes; when He was tried before Pontius Pilate;
when He noticed Zacchaeus in the tree

Related qualities that bring balance:

Discretion, Discernment, Gentleness, Forgiveness, Reverence, Humility, Compassion

How does this quality relate to the Scripture passage and/or major concept?

When Jesus saw the multitudes, He was alert. He saw every need in each person, and He acted promptly in delivering a message of truth that applied to each one.

Three ways my family and I can demonstrate this quality this month:
